Water & Sewer

- Water Monthly Readiness to Serve Fee (residential ¾" meter).....\$17.60
- Monthly Water Usage.....\$4.05/1000 gallons
- Sewer Monthly Readiness to Serve Fee (residential ¾" meter).....\$38.00
- Monthly Sewer Usage Charge.....\$5.00/1000 gallons
- *If you are a business owner, or a home without a ¾" meter, please contact the Clerk's office for more information, as your readiness to serve fees will be different than those listed above.*

Water and Sewer are provided by the Village of Lawton. An \$80 deposit is required to open your account. You will be billed monthly for your service. Bills will be issued around the 8th of the month and are due on the 25th of the month (unless the 25th falls on a weekend or holiday, in which case the due date will be the next business day). A 10% late penalty will be applied on the following business day for all unpaid bills. Payments can be made to the Village of Lawton via cash, check, money order, or credit card. Paying by Credit card has a 3% fee attached. Bills can be paid online [via link on our website](#).

Library

The Lawton Public Library is located in Village Hall, 125 S. Main Street. Hours of Operation are Monday through Friday 10:00am-6:00pm (Closed Thursdays), and Saturdays 10:00 AM-2:00PM. 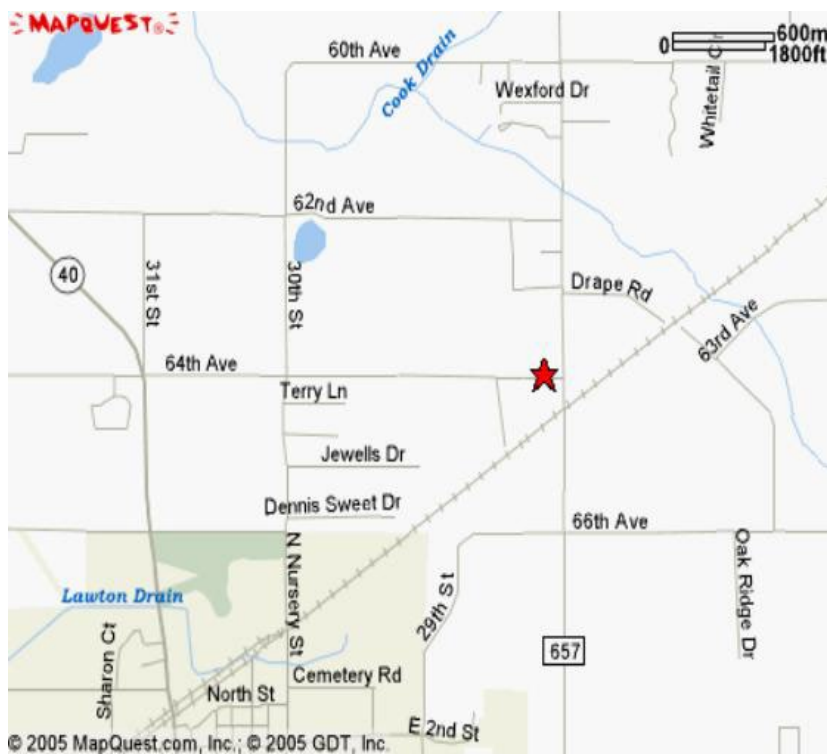
Permits

- Construction performed within the Village of Lawton may require one or more permits. Building, Mechanical, Electrical, and Plumbing permits are handled through Safebuilt. Safebuilt can be contacted at 269-729-9244.
- The Following permits can be found in the clerk’s office, or on our website:
 - Sign Permit
 - Peddlers Permit
 - Zoning Permits
 - Demolition Permits
 - Right of Way Permits
 - Fence Permit
 - Fences require permits, and are subject to the zoning ordinances that can be found on the village website <https://www.lawtonmi.org/>. These permits are available to property owners at no cost, however, must be approved by the Village Manager prior to construction.
 - Garage Sale Permits
 - Garage sales require permits, which are available (at no cost) from the Village Clerk’s Office. Individual residents are limited to two sales per year (3 days) at each location.

What does Antwerp Township Handle for Residents?

- Village of Lawton Taxes are collected by Bonnie Osborne, Antwerp Township Treasurer. Payments are to be made to Antwerp Township and can be mailed or brought in person to the Township Office, 24821 Front Ave, Mattawan, MI 49071-9501.
- Property Transfer Affidavits, and Principle Residential Exemption Form (if applicable) go through Antwerp township. Visit their website at www.antwerptownship.com for more information.
- Recycling cards for the Antwerp Township Transfer Station located on Township Transfer station Road can be obtained at the Antwerp Township Office in Mattawan.

How to Report an Issue

Power or Street Light Outages—Streetlight or general power outages should be reported to Indiana Michigan Power. For burned out or flickering street lights, [visit this street light problem webpage](#). For power outages, visit [Indiana Michigan's Outages & Restoring Power](#). You may also call 800.311.4634.

File an Ordinance Investigation –if you would like to report an issue with the police department that is a non-emergency for things such as abandoned vehicles, overgrown weeds or grass, a sidewalk hazard, a sign violation, yard waste, or trash, you can find the fillable form [on our website](#), or contact the Village office by phone at 269.624.2382

Yard or Brush Issue—If you have questions or concerns on the yard waste pickup schedule, or need to report downed branches after a storm, you can contact the Department of Public Works at 269.624.6406.

Common Ordinance Violations

An Extensive List of Lawton's Village Ordinances can be [found on our website](#). Here are some ordinances that residents commonly have questions on.

Ordinance 93.01 ANTI-BLIGHT (GRASS)

(10) In any area, the existence of grass, weeds, or brush that constitute a fire hazard or is in violation of this Section governing the cutting and destroying of grass, weeds, and brush in the Village. (a) Developed property: Property that has been developed in any zone must be maintained in such a way that growth does not exceed 8" in height. (b) Undeveloped or vacant property: Property that has not been developed in any zone must be maintained as follows: (1) The interior of the property may be left to grow (2) The perimeter of the property on all sides

must be cut 6 feet back from the property lines and street side to 8 inches or less a distance of 6 feet. Please see Village Ordinance for more details.

Ordinance 93.01 ANTI-BLIGHT (JUNK/TRASH)

(3) In any area, the storage or accumulation of junk, trash, rubbish, or refuse of any kind, except domestic refuse stored in such a manner as not to create a nuisance. The term “junk” shall include bottles, cans, garbage, rubbish, parts of machinery or motor vehicles, appliances stored in the open, remnants of wood, metal or any other materials and/or building materials, or other cast-off material of any kind, whether or not the same could be put to any reasonable use. Please see Village Ordinance for more details.

Burning Ordinance 93.02

Open Burning in the Village of Lawton is prohibited. Burning of materials such as: trees, logs, shrubs, brush, leaves, refuse and grass that DO NOT fit in a burn pit or patio is prohibited. Please see Village Ordinance for more details.

Yard Waste & Brush Collection

Brush Pickup is done April-November by zone. Zone 1 includes everything north of 3rd Street and will be picked up on the First and Third weeks of the month. Zone 2 includes everything South of Third Street and will be picked up on the Second and Fourth weeks of the month. Residents need to have brush to the street by 7 am on the Monday of their scheduled pick-up week. Brush should be stacked next to the road in one pile that does not exceed 4 feet in height, with branch sections no longer than 8 feet in length, and no thicker than 4 inches in diameter.
